SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

I may speak in the languages of humans and of angels. But if I don't have love, I am a loud gong or a clashing cymbal. I may have the gift to speak what God has revealed, and I may understand all mysteries and have all knowledge. I may even have enough faith to move mountains. But if I don't have love, I am nothing. I may even give away all that I have and give up my body to be burned. But if I don't have love, none of these things will help me.

Love is patient. Love is kind. Love isn't jealous. It doesn't sing its own praises. It isn't arrogant. It isn't rude. It doesn't think about itself. It isn't irritable. It doesn't keep track of wrongs. It isn't happy when injustice is done, but it is happy with the truth. Love never stops being patient, never stops believing, never stops hoping, never gives up.

Love never comes to an end. There is the gift of speaking what God has revealed, but it will no longer be used. There is the gift of speaking in other languages, but it will stop by itself. There is the gift of knowledge, but it will no longer be used. Our knowledge is incomplete and our ability to speak what God has revealed is incomplete. But when what is complete comes, then what is incomplete will no longer be used. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, thought like a child, and reasoned like a child. When I became an adult, I no longer used childish ways. Now we see a blurred image in a mirror. Then we will see very clearly. Now my knowledge is incomplete. Then I will have complete knowledge as God has complete knowledge of me.

So these three things remain: faith, hope, and love. But the best one of these is love. - GW®



A MESSAGE FROM COMMUNITY IMPACT COMMITTEE TO THE CONGREGATION

The Community Impact Committee had hoped to alert the congregation about human trafficking of our community's children. We had hoped to alert and give knowledge on our annual Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, which is Sunday, February 6. The committee started planning last October. We desired a speaker who could effectively inform us on human trafficking, so we in turn would be alert to this wickedness.

This is what we already knew as we began planning: "Human trafficking, also known as trafficking in persons or modern-day slavery, is a crime that involves compelling or coercing a person to provide labor or services, or to engage in commercial sex acts. The coercion can be subtle or overt, physical or psychological. Exploitation of a minor for commercial sex is human trafficking, regardless of whether any form of force, fraud, or coercion was used." (U.S. Dept. of Justice)

As we prepared to present to you we realized we needed to know more ourselves to select the best speaker(s). Some members were able to attend human trafficking task force zoom meetings and ask for resources. We found the more we learned, the more we didn't know.

January is <u>National Human Trafficking Prevention Month</u>. Every year since 2010, the President has dedicated the month to raise awareness about human trafficking and to educate the public about how to identify and prevent this crime. The U.S. Department of State raises awareness of human trafficking domestically and abroad, through U.S. embassies and consulates. (U.S. Dept. of State) Note: In 2019 there were 1507 *reported cases* of human trafficking in California. **Be alert to messages in print or TV this month.**
