FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: *Isaiah 6:1-8*

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: *1 Corinthians 14:12b-20*

THE HOLY GOSPEL: *Luke 5:1-11*

One day Jesus was standing by the Sea of Galilee. The people crowded around Him as they listened to God's word. Jesus saw two boats on the shore. 
