

FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: Joshua 24:14-27

"Fear the LORD, and serve Him with integrity and faithfulness. Get rid of the gods your ancestors served on the other side of the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and serve only the LORD. But if you don't want to serve the LORD, then choose today whom you will serve. Even if you choose the gods your ancestors served on the other side of the Euphrates or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you live, my family and I will still serve the LORD."

The people responded, "It would be unthinkable for us to abandon the LORD to serve other gods. The LORD our God brought us and our ancestors out of slavery in Egypt. He did these spectacular signs right before our eyes. He guarded us wherever we went, especially as we passed through other nations. The LORD forced out all the people ahead of us, including the Amorites who lived in this land. We, too, will serve the LORD, because He is our God."

But Joshua answered the people, "Since the LORD is a holy God, you can't possibly serve Him. He is a God who does not tolerate rivals. He will not forgive your rebellious acts and sins. If you abandon the LORD and serve foreign gods, He will turn and bring disaster on you. He will destroy you, although he has been so good to you."

The people answered Joshua, "No! We will only serve the LORD!"

Joshua said to the people, "You have testified that you have chosen to serve the LORD."

They answered, "Yes, we have!"

"Get rid of the foreign gods that are among you. Turn yourselves entirely over to the LORD God of Israel."

The people replied to Joshua, "We will serve the LORD our God and obey Him."

That day Joshua made an agreement for the people and set up laws and rules for them at Shechem. Joshua wrote these things in the Book of God's Teachings. Then he took a large stone and set it up under the oak tree at the LORD's holy place. Joshua told all the people, "This stone will stand as a witness for us. It has heard all the words which the LORD spoke to us. It will stand as a witness for you. You cannot deceive your God." — GW®

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: Acts 9:10-19a

A disciple named Ananias lived in the city of Damascus. The Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias!"

Ananias answered, "Yes, Lord."

The Lord told him, "Get up! Go to Judas' house on Straight Street, and ask for a man named Saul from the city of Tarsus. He's praying. In a vision he has seen a man named Ananias place his hands on him to restore his sight."

Ananias replied, "Lord, I've heard a lot of people tell about the many evil things this man has done to Your people in Jerusalem. Saul has come here to Damascus with authority from the chief priests to put anyone who calls on Your name in prison."

The Lord told Ananias, "Go! I've chosen this man to bring my name to nations, to kings, and to the people of Israel. I'll show him how much he has to suffer for the sake of my name."

Ananias left and entered Judas' house. After he placed his hands on Saul, Ananias said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way to Damascus, sent me to you. He wants you to see again and to be filled with the Holy Spirit."

Immediately, something like fish scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. Then Saul stood up and was baptized. After he had something to eat, his strength came back to him. - GW®



The Pharisees and their experts in Moses' Teachings complained to Jesus' disciples. They asked, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?"





HOUSEHOLD HUDDLES FOR LENT 2022

One of the key characteristics of Households of Faith is that they spend time with one another. The Biblical idea of households is far beyond just the nuclear family that may share the same four walls. In the pages of Scripture, households included multiple generations, different vocations, and many permutations. You might be surprised to see what makes up your household and how many households you may be a part of. We hope that this Lent you will gather with the households you are a part of for something

we call a Household Huddle.

A Household Huddle is a time of directed activity that will foster spiritual habits, invite conversations and be open to welcoming others. We would like to encourage you to engage in a household huddle at least once a week.

The pattern for a Household Huddle includes the following:

- SHARE your highs and lows.
- READ a Bible verse or a story.
- TALK together about how the reading impacted you, share what you think God might be teaching you and ask some questions about the reading.
- PRAY for one another.
- BLESS one another in words and actions.

It will take time to get into a pattern or rhythm with the members of your household so we suggest scheduling the same time and day each week when you begin. To get you started we will provide a basic outline for your household huddle. Feel free to adapt this according to your needs.

HOUSEHOLD HUDDLE FOR THE WEEK OF MARCH 6

SHARE your highs and lows

Ask each person in your household to share something positive that happened or an encounter that brought them joy over the past day or week. It could be a connection with a friend or co-worker, it could be a book they are reading or something fun that happened at the grocery store. After sharing a high, each person can share a low. These might include things that were hard, sad, or difficult. It might be a strained relationship or a disappointment at school. Highs and lows are shared in confidence and should not be shared outside the huddle unless expressly permitted. Often time what is shared during the highs and lows can inform the prayer that you will share together later in the huddle.

READ A Bible verse or story

Reading for this week: Joshua 24:14-27

TALK about the reading

- How would you define a household?
- Why do you think the people in the reading wanted to serve God?
- What does it mean to serve together as a household?
- How might this household huddle be a way of serving one another and serving the Lord?

PRAY for one another

Thinking about what was shared in your household huddle, how can you pray for one another?

BLESS one another in words and actions


Have someone read the following blessing aloud to the members of your household.
