Welcome to Bethany Lutheran Church:

It is our earnest prayer that in this service of worship we glorify God and edify each other as we deepen our relationship with Christ and our fellowship with His people. AS WE GATHER:

This is the longest worship service on the Church calendar. Though you just started reading these words, this service began last night. Though we departed the table and went home, last night's service contained no benediction, nor shall today's. Before today's service is over, Christ shall fall silent, all shall go dark, and the Lord of life shall be buried in a borrowed tomb. But His story and this service are both far from over. The service that began last night shall not end until two days from now, when we say, "Christ is Risen indeed!" The grandest public celebration of our Lord's three day stay in a tomb; and His victory over the three foes of sin, death and the devil is observed in one service held over three days: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

READING: John 19:25-30 (Jesus' mother and His death)


PRAYER:
