

Leader: Through Jesus' resurrection from the dead, a new day has dawned.

Yet, I admit that like those who came to the tomb that first Easter, I have been slow to understand God's Word. Like the disciples, who when they first heard that Jesus had risen, I too must confess that I have failed to

always trust God's promises.

People: I confess before the Lord,

Who is resurrection and life,

and before all of you who will also return to dust,

that like those who left the graveside trembling and afraid,

I have often sought the living among the dead and so, I have returned, over and over again, to the same temptations, addictions and actions

which nailed Jesus to the cross.

For Your own name's sake, Lord Jesus,

forgive me my sins. As You live, give me life.

As You have risen, cause me to rise. Amen.


Leader: Jesus is alive!

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 24:1-12

Very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb. They were carrying the spices that they had prepared. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb. When they went in, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were puzzled about this, two men in clothes that were as bright as lightning suddenly stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed to the ground.

The men asked the women, "Why are you looking among the dead for the living one? He's not here. He has been brought back to life! Remember what He told you while He was still in Galilee. SERMON: "Easter Fools"



CONFESSION OF FAITH:

Leader: As a Christian your very life is a daily confession that Jesus, Who was

crucified for your sin, has risen for your salvation.

(Second Article of the Apostles' Creed.)

People: We believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,

Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried.

He descended into hell.

The third day He rose again from the dead.

He ascended into heaven

and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Leader: What does this mean?

People: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God,

begotten of the Father from eternity,

and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, Who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death,

and from the power of the devil;

not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood

and with His innocent suffering and death,

that I may be His own, and live under Him in His kingdom

and serve Him in everlasting righteousness,

innocence, and blessedness,

just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity.

This is most certainly true.

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Bethany in the joyful confession that our Lord gives us His very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins in this sacrament. God intends this gift for His children who recognize their sin, trust in Christ as their Savior, desire to live for Him alone and join in this joyful confession.

To help you prepare for communion we invite you to take a few moments of quiet prayer. For aid there are prayers on the front page of the hymnal for both before and after the reception of communion. Or simply pray, Dear Lord Jesus, at Your gracious invitation You invite me to come to You, to eat and drink Your holy body and blood as You Yourself have promised to give in this sacrament of Your altar. Forgive me of my sin, through this Your meal of Forgiveness. Let me experience the fullness of Your love, through this Your meal of love. Strengthen my faith, through this meal of Yours that calls for and bestows faith. Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION:

Leader: By dying, Christ destroyed our death.

In rising, Christ has restored our life.

In giving us His Spirit, Christ has granted us peace.


The peace of the Lord be with you.

We will not kneel at the altar, rather we will join the procession of saints and come forward and remain standing as we receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.

For those communing, who so desire, the center cups in each tray are <u>alcohol free</u>; and the tray of wafers in front of the baptismal font are <u>gluten free</u>. If needed for dietary restrictions, take a gluten free wafer on your way to the rail. For those wishing to use a self-contained communion chalice, let an usher know.





HOUSEHOLD HUDDLE

One of the key characteristics of Households of Faith is that they spend time with one another. The Biblical idea of households is far beyond just the nuclear family that may share the same four walls. In the pages of Scripture households included multiple generations, different vocations, and many permutations. You might be surprised to see what makes up your household and how many households you may be a part of. We hope that this Lent you will gather with the households you are a part of for something we call a Household Huddle.

A Household Huddle is a time of directed activity that will foster spiritual habits, invite conversations and be open to welcoming others. We would like to encourage you to engage in a household huddle at least once a week.

The pattern for a Household Huddle includes the following:

- **SHARE** your highs and lows.
- **READ** a Bible verse or a story.
- TALK together about how the reading impacted you, share what you think God might be teaching you and ask some questions about the reading.
- **PRAY** for one another.
- **BLESS** one another in words and actions.

It will take time to get into a pattern or rhythm with the members of your household so we suggest scheduling the same time and day each week when you begin. To get you started we will provide a basic outline for your household huddle. Feel free to adapt this according to your needs.

HOUSEHOLD HUDDLE FOR THE WEEK OF APRIL 17TH

SHARE your highs and lows

Ask each person in your household to share something positive that happened or an encounter that brought them joy over the past day or week. It could be a connection with a friend or coworker, it could be a book they are reading or something fun that happened at the grocery store. After sharing a high, each person can share a low. These might include things that were hard, sad, or difficult. It might be a strained relationship or a disappointment at school. Highs and lows are shared in confidence and should not be shared outside the huddle unless expressly permitted. Often time what is shared during the highs and lows can inform the prayer that you will share together later in the huddle.

READ A Bible verse or story

Reading for this week: Luke 24:1-12

TALK about the readings

- Share your favorite part about the Easter story.
- If you had to tell the Easter story in 10 seconds, how would you do it?
- How can you remember Easter every day of the year?
- Who do you know that needs to hear about the story of Easter? How can you share it with them?

PRAY for one another

Thinking about what has been shared already in your household huddle, how can you pray for one another today?

BLESS one another in words and actions

Have someone read the following blessing aloud to the members of your household. May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give us all the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice we may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. AMEN!
