

CALL TO WORSHIP: (Based on Isaiah 42)

Leader: You have been set free from sin and are now servants of God.

People: For the wages of sin is death,

FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: Acts 5:12-32

The people saw the apostles perform many miracles and do amazing things. The believers had a common faith in Jesus as they met on Solomon's Porch. None of the other people dared to join them, although everyone spoke highly of them. More men and women than ever began to believe in the Lord. As a result, people carried their sick into the streets. They placed them on stretchers and cots so that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some sick people as he went by. Crowds from the cities around Jerusalem would gather. They would bring their sick and those who were troubled by evil spirits, and each person was cured.

The chief priest and the whole party of the Sadducees who were with him were extremely jealous. So they took action by arresting the apostles and putting them in the city jail. But at night an angel from the Lord opened the doors to their cell and led them out of the prison. The angel told them, "Stand in the temple courtyard, and tell the people everything about life in Christ."

Early in the morning, after they had listened to the angel, the apostles went into the temple courtyard and began to teach.


The chief priest and those who were with him called together the Jewish council, that is, all the leaders of Israel. They also sent men to the prison to get the apostles. When the temple guards arrived at the prison, they didn't find the apostles. The guards came back and reported, "We found the prison securely locked and the guards standing at the doors. However, when we opened the doors, we found no one inside." When the officer of the temple guards and the chief priests heard this, they were puzzled about what could have happened.

Then someone told them, "The men you put in prison are standing in the temple courtyard. They're teaching the people."

Then the officer of the temple guards went with some of his men to bring back the apostles without using force. After all, the officer and his guards were afraid that the people would stone them to death for using force. When they brought back the apostles, they made them stand in front of the council. The chief priest questioned them. He said, "We gave you strict orders not to mention Jesus' name when you teach. Yet, you've filled Jerusalem with your teachings. You want to take revenge on us for putting that man to death."

Peter and the other apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than people. You murdered Jesus by hanging Him on a cross. But the God of our ancestors brought Him back to life. God used His power to give Jesus the honored position—the one next to Him on the heavenly throne as leader and savior. He did this to lead the people of Israel to Him, to change the way they think and act, and to forgive their sins. We are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him." – GW®

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

That Sunday evening, the disciples were together behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jews. Jesus stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you!" When He said this, He showed them His hands and His side. The disciples were glad to see the Lord.

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you." After He had said this, He breathed on the disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whenever you forgive sins, they are forgiven. Whenever you don't forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Thomas, one of the twelve apostles, who was called Didymus, wasn't with them when Jesus came. The other disciples told him, "We've seen the Lord."

Thomas told them, "I refuse to believe this unless I see the nail marks in His hands, put my fingers into them, and put my hand into His side."



HOUSEHOLD HUDDLE

One of the key characteristics of Households of Faith is that they spend time with one another. The Biblical idea of households is far beyond just the nuclear family that may share the same four walls. In the pages of Scripture households included multiple generations, different vocations, and many permutations. You might be surprised to see what makes up your household and how many households you may be a part of. We hope that this Lent you will gather with the households you are a part of for something we call a Household Huddle. A Household Huddle is a time of directed activity that will foster spiritual habits, invite conversations and be open to welcoming others. We would like to encourage you to engage in a household huddle at least once a week.

The pattern for a Household Huddle includes the following:

- **SHARE** your highs and lows.
- **READ** a Bible verse or a story.
- TALK together about how the reading impacted you, share what you think God might be teaching you and ask some questions about the reading.
- **PRAY** for one another.
- **BLESS** one another in words and actions.

It will take time to get into a pattern or rhythm with the members of your household so we suggest scheduling the same time and day each week when you begin. To get you started we will provide a basic outline for your household huddle. Feel free to adapt this according to your needs.

HOUSEHOLD HUDDLE FOR THE WEEK OF APRIL 24TH

SHARE your highs and lows

Ask each person in your household to share something positive that happened or an encounter that brought them joy over the past day or week. It could be a connection with a friend or coworker, it could be a book they are reading or something fun that happened at the grocery store. After sharing a high, each person can share a low. These might include things that were hard, sad, or difficult. It might be a strained relationship or a disappointment at school. Highs and lows are shared in confidence and should not be shared outside the huddle unless expressly permitted. Often time what is shared during the highs and lows can inform the prayer that you will share together later in the huddle.

READ A Bible verse or story

Reading for this week: John 20:19-31

TALK about the readings

- What are some things you doubt about?
- What does peace mean to you?
- What kind of peace does Jesus give?
- How does Jesus help us to believe and not doubt?

PRAY for one another

Thinking about what was shared in your household huddle, how can you pray for one another today?

BLESS one another in words and actions

Have someone read the following blessing aloud to the members of your household. May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give us all the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice we may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. AMEN!
