FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

 \boldsymbol{D} oes not wisdom call out?

Does not understanding raise its voice?

Wisdom takes its stand on high ground,

by the wayside where the roads meet, near the gates to the city.

At the entrance wisdom sings its song,

"I am calling to all of you, and my appeal is to all people...

"The LORD already possessed me long ago,

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: Acts 2:22-36

"Men of Israel, listen to what I say: Jesus from Nazareth was a man whom God brought to your attention. You know that through this man God worked miracles, did amazing things, and gave signs. By using men who don't acknowledge Moses' Teachings, you crucified Jesus, who was given over to death by a plan that God had determined in advance. But God brought Him from death back to life and destroyed the pains of death, because death had no power to hold Him. This is what David meant when he said about Jesus:

'I always see the Lord in front of me.

I cannot be moved because He is by my side.

That is why my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices.

My body also rests securely
because you do not abandon my soul to the grave
or allow your holy one to decay.

You make the path of life known to me.

In your presence there is complete joy.'

"Brothers, I can tell you confidently that our ancestor David died and was buried and that his tomb is here to this day. David was a prophet and knew that God had promised with an oath that he would place one of David's descendants on his throne. David knew that the Messiah would come back to life, and he spoke about that before it ever happened. He said that the Messiah wouldn't be left in the grave and that His body wouldn't decay.

"God brought this man Jesus back to life. We are all witnesses to that. God the Father used His power to give Jesus the honored position—the one next to Him on the heavenly throne. Jesus has also received and has poured out the Holy Spirit as the Father had promised, and this is what you're seeing and hearing. David didn't go up to heaven, but he said.

'The Lord said to my Lord, "Take the honored position—the one next to me [God the Father] on the heavenly throne—until I put your enemies under your control." '

"All the people of Israel should know beyond a doubt that God made Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ." - GW \otimes

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 8:48-59

The Jews replied to Jesus, "Aren't we right when we say that You're a Samaritan and that You're possessed by a demon?"

Jesus answered, "I'm not possessed. I honor my Father, but you dishonor me. I don't want my own glory. But there is someone who wants it, and He is the judge. I can guarantee this truth: Whoever obeys what I say will never see death."


The Jews told Jesus, "Now we know that You're possessed by a demon. Abraham died, and so did the prophets, but You say, 'Whoever does what I say will never taste death.' Are You greater than our father Abraham, who died? The prophets have also died. Who do You think You are?"

Jesus said, "If I bring glory to myself, my glory is nothing. My Father is the one who gives me glory, and you say that He is your God. Yet, you haven't known Him. However, I know Him. If I would say that I didn't know Him, I would be a liar like all of you. But I do know Him, and I do what He says. Your father Abraham was pleased to see that my day was coming. He saw it and was happy."


The Jews said to Jesus, "You're not even fifty years old. How could You have seen Abraham?"

SERMON



ATHANASIAN CREED: (* catholic means the universal Christian Church)

Leader: Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the *catholic faith.

Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled

will without doubt perish eternally.

And the *catholic faith is this,

that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity,

neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.

For the Father is one person, the Son is another,

and the Holy Spirit is another.

But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son

and of the Holy Spirit is one:

the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.

Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:

the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;

the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;

the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.

And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal,

just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites,

but one Uncreated and one Infinite.

In the same way, the Father is almighty,

the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;

and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, and Holy Spirit is God;

and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;

and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.

Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth

to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord,

so also are we prohibited by the *catholic religion

to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

People:

The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.

The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.

The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son,

neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers;

one Son, not three Sons;

one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

And in this Trinity none is before or after another;

none is greater or less than another;

but the whole three persons

are coeternal with each other and coequal,

so that in all things, as has been stated above,

the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.

Leader:

Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.

But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation

that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess

that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God,

is at the same time both God and man.

People:

He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages;

and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:

perfect God and perfect man,

composed of a rational soul and human flesh;

equal to the Father with respect to His divinity,

less than the Father with respect to His humanity.

Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:

one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh,

but by the assumption of the humanity into God;

one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.

Leader: For as the rational soul and flesh is one man,

so God and man is one Christ, who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell rose again the third day from the dead,

ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead. At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies

and give an account concerning their own deeds.

And those who have done good will enter into eternal life,

and those who have done evil into eternal fire.

People: This is the *catholic faith;

whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.


