<u>Please</u> place cell phones and electronic devices on mute as you join us in worship this morning. Thank you.


RE-FORMATION: A Church Ever Reforming... The Truth Never Changing

It has been 500 years since Luther completed his translation of the New Testament; vital for a movement that confessed the Scripture Alone as the source of faith and life for the Christian. The core declaration of the Reformation is a summation of the major theme of the Scriptures: That we are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, for Christ's sake alone, apart from works of the law; and in our lives are called to serve others as a priesthood of believers to the Glory of God alone.

Thus, even while we celebrate an event that occurred more than 500 years ago. We also celebrate that the Reformation is not just something that happened in time, but that it is continually happening **in, to and through** us. As we stand firm on these never changing truths, we find the Spirit of our Lord is ever at work changing us from self-focus and self-preoccupation. The change, this Re-formation, moves us to be ever more Christ-focused and ever more occupied with God's mission that others too experience a personal "re-formation".

Leader: God the Father, God the + Son, God the Holy Spirit.


People: All three are one divine essence, eternal, without division,

Leader: Since the fall of Adam all people are conceived and born in sin; and by nature

are full of evil lust and inclinations, and are unable by nature to have true fear

of God and true faith in God.

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION OF SINS:

(Adapted from Luther's Small Catechism & Article 4 of the Augsburg Confession)

Leader: Do you believe that this is true of you, that you are a sinner?

People: Yes, I believe it; I am a sinner.

Leader: How do you know this?

People: From the Ten Commandments, for these I have not kept.

Leader: Are you sorry for your sins?

People: Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God

and against my brothers and sisters.

Leader: What do you deserve from God because of your sins?

People: I deserve God's displeasure, wrath and punishment,

as well as temporal and eternal death.

Leader: Do you hope to be saved? **People:** Yes, that is my hope.

Leader: How can you hold such hope? In Whom, then, do you trust?

People: In my dear Lord, Jesus Christ.

Leader: What has Christ done for you that you trust in Him?

People: He died for me on the cross and shed His blood for my forgiveness.

Leader: What moved Christ to offer Himself

in order to make payment for your sins?


People: His great love for His Father, for me, and for all sinners.

Leader: While we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin and righteousness before God

by our own merits, works or satisfactions; we receive forgiveness of sin and become righteous before God by grace, for Christ's sake, through faith, when we believe that Christ suffered for us and that for His sake our sin is forgiven and righteousness and eternal life are given to us. Therefore, as you believe, so let it be. Now I, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: To God Alone be the Glory! Alleluia, Amen.

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: Romans 3:19-28

We know that whatever the Scriptures say applies to everyone under their influence, and no one can say a thing. The whole world is brought under the judgment of God. Not one person can have God's approval by any effort to follow the laws in the Scriptures. These laws show what sin is.

Now, the way to receive God's approval has been made plain in a way other than the laws in the Scriptures. Moses' Teachings and the Prophets tell us this. Everyone who believes has God's approval through faith in Jesus Christ.

There is no difference between people. Because all people have sinned, they have fallen short of God's glory. They receive God's approval freely by an act of his kindness through the price Christ Jesus paid to set us free from sin. God showed that Christ is the throne of mercy where God's approval is given through faith in Christ's blood. In his patience God waited to deal with sins committed in the past. He waited so that he could display his approval at the present time. This shows that he is a God of justice, a God who approves of people who believe in Jesus.

So, do we have anything to brag about? Bragging has been eliminated. On what basis was it eliminated? On the basis of our own efforts? No, indeed! Rather, it is eliminated on the basis of faith. We conclude that a person has God's approval by faith, not by his own efforts. $-GW \otimes$

Text: John 8



APOSTLES' CREED: First, Second and Third Articles with Its Meanings

Leader: Join me as we confess the First Article and Its Meaning – *Creation*.

People: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Leader: What does this mean?

People: I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me

my body and soul, eyes, ears and all my members, my reason and all my

senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, spouse and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily

provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.

He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank

and praise, serve and obey Him.

This is most certainly true.

Leader: Join me as we confess the Second Article and Its Meaning – *Redemption*.

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by

the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to

judge the living and the dead.

Leader: What does this mean?

People: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from

eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own, and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all

eternity.

This is most certainly true.

Leader: Join me as we confess the Third Article and Its Meaning – Sanctification.

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church the communion of

saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life

everlasting. Amen.

Leader: What does this mean?

People: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus

Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the

true faith.

In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true

faith.

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the

sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to

me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

People: Your will is done when You curb and destroy the purpose of the devil,

May this Your good and gracious will be done in us until the end. Amen.

People: Thank You good and gracious God for Your daily blessings

by which You provide all things needed to support our bodies and lives.

Leader: Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us;

People: We pray, dear Father, that You would not look at our sins,

nor deny our prayers because of them.

Leader: And lead us not into temptation,

People: We pray, Lord, that You would guard and keep us so that the devil, the

world and our sinful nature may not deceive or mislead us. Amen.

Leader: Deliver us from evil.

People: We pray, Almighty God, that You would rescue us from every evil,

and at last, when the hour of death comes,

You would grant us a blessed end

and graciously take us from this world of sorrow to Yourself in heaven.
