Before worship, talk to God! (see inside cover of hymnal for pre-service prayer prompts)


During worship, let God talk to you!

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: 1 John 3:11-18

CHILDREN'S SERMON

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 11:2-15

When John was in prison, he heard about the things Christ had done. So he sent his disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the One who is coming, or should we look for someone else?"

Jesus answered John's disciples, "Go back, and tell John what you hear and see: Blind people see again, lame people are walking, those with skin diseases are made clean, deaf people hear again, dead people are brought back to life, and poor people hear the Good News. Whoever doesn't lose his faith in Me is indeed blessed."

As they were leaving, Jesus spoke to the crowds about John. "What did you go into the desert to see? Tall grass swaying in the wind? Really, what did you go to see? A man dressed in fine clothes? Those who wear fine clothes are in royal palaces.

"Really, what did you go to see? A prophet? Let me tell you that he is far more than a prophet. John is the one about whom Scripture says,

'I'm sending My messenger ahead of you to prepare the way in front of you.'

"I can guarantee this truth: Of all the people ever born, no one is greater than John the Baptizer. Yet, the least important person in the kingdom of heaven is greater than John. From the time of John the Baptizer until now, the kingdom of heaven has been forcefully advancing, and forceful people have been seizing it. All the Prophets and Moses' Teachings prophesied up to the time of John. If you are willing to accept their message, John is the Elijah who was to come. Let the person who has ears listen! — GW ®

Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts.

for those with dietary restrictions, please take a gluten free wafer.


For those wishing to use a self-contained communion chalice, let an usher know.


