CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS:

Leader: Lord of life, in Your Son, You have taken on our flesh that You might redeem us from our lost condition.

People: Incarnate Savior. we confess that our very nature is fallen and depraved. We have not drawn near to You. we have not always held Your teaching close to our heart, and we have failed to love You as passionately as we love the things of this world. You were born to heal us. Your infant hands will soon enough be pierced for our transgressions. So forgive us our sins anew we pray; and send us Your Spirit that we might cradle You in our hearts and herald Your coming into our world. Amen. CHRISTMAS PRAYER: [adapted from St. Ephraim of Syria's Christ prayer (AD 306-373)]

Leader: This celebration of Your birth resembles You, Lord, because it brings joy to all humanity. The high and lowly, elderly and young alike rejoice in Your day. This feast is celebrated from generation to generation. Kings and emperors pass away, and the festivals to commemorate them soon lapse. But Your day will be heralded until the end of time. This day is a pledge of peace. For at Your birth heaven and earth were reconciled, for You came from heaven to earth on that day and You forgave our sins and wiped away our guilt. You are light for the blind; a cup of living water for parched souls; and You are the bread of life for those who hunger for righteousness. In the winter when trees are bare, You give us the most succulent fruit of the Spirit. And in December when seeds are hidden in the soil, the staff of life springs forth from the virgin's womb.



OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: Isaiah 52:7-10

*H*ow beautiful on the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces the good news, "All is well." He brings the good news, announces salvation, and tells Zion that its God rules as king.

Listen! Your watchmen raise their voices and shout together joyfully. When the LORD brings Zion back, they will see it with their own eyes. Break out into shouts of joy, ruins of Jerusalem. The LORD will comfort His people. He will reclaim Jerusalem. The LORD will show His holy power to all the nations. All the ends of the earth will see the salvation of our God. – GW®

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Hebrews 1:1-6

In the past God spoke to our ancestors at many different times and in many different ways through the prophets. In these last days he has spoken to us through His Son. God made His Son responsible for everything. His Son is the One through whom God made the universe. His Son is the reflection of God's glory and the exact likeness of God's being. He holds everything together through His powerful words. After He had cleansed people from their sins, He now holds the honored position—the one next to the majestic God the Father on the heavenly throne.

The Son has become greater than the angels since He has been given a name that is superior to theirs. God never said to any of His angels,

"You are my Son. Today I have become your Father."

And God never said to any of His angels,

"I will be His Father, and He will be My Son."

When God was about to send His firstborn Son into the world, He said,

"All of God's angels must worship Him." - GW®



THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 1:1-18

I n the beginning the Word already existed. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was already with God in the beginning.

Everything came into existence through Him. Not one thing that exists was made without Him.

He was the source of life, and that life was the light for humanity.

The light shines in the dark, and the dark has never extinguished it.

God sent a man named John to be His messenger. John came to declare the truth about the light so that everyone would become believers through his message. John was not the light, but he came to declare the truth about the light.




The real light, which shines on everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into existence through Him. Yet, the world didn't recognize Him. He went to His own people, and His own people didn't accept Him. However, He gave the right to become God's children to everyone who believed in Him. These people didn't become God's children in a physical way—from a human impulse or from a husband's desire to have a child. They were born from God.


The Word became human and lived among us. We saw His glory. It was the glory that the Father shares with His only Son, a glory full of kindness and truth.

(John declared the truth about Him when he said loudly, "This is the person about whom I said, 'The One who comes after me was before me because He existed before I did."")

Each of us has received one gift after another because of all that the Word is. Laws were given through Moses, but kindness and truth came into existence through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. God's only Son, the One who is closest to the Father's heart, has made Him known. - GW®


