FIRST SCRIPTURE READING: Isaiah 42:1-9

Here is my servant, whom I support. Here is my chosen one, with whom I am pleased. I have put my Spirit on him. He will bring justice to the nations.

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING: Romans 6:1-11

What should we say then? Should we continue to sin so that God's kindness will increase? That's unthinkable! As far as sin is concerned, we have died. So how can we still live under sin's influence?

Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? When we were baptized into His death, we were placed into the tomb with Him. As Christ was brought back from death to life by the glorious power of the Father, so we, too, should live a new kind of life. If we've become united with Him in a death like His, certainly we will also be united with Him when we come back to life as He did. We know that the person we used to be was crucified with Him to put an end to sin in our bodies. Because of this we are no longer slaves to sin. The person who has died has been freed from sin.

If we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him. We know that Christ, who was brought back to life, will never die again. Death no longer has any power over Him. When He died, He died once and for all to sin's power. But now He lives, and He lives for God. So consider yourselves dead to sin's power but living for God in the power Christ Jesus gives you. - GW

PRAYERS OF THE CHURCH

LORD'S PRAYER:

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Leader: The Word of God teaches that we are all conceived and born sinful and would be lost forever unless delivered from sin, death and everlasting condemnation. But the Father of all mercy and grace has sent His Son Jesus Christ, who atoned for the sin of the whole world, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life.

- People: Almighty God, I confess that I do not deserve eternal life and that I am in need of forgiveness; while I am Your baptized child, I am still by nature a child of Adam and my thoughts, words and deeds that have dishonored you and of which I am ashamed bear witness to need for Your mercy and grace.
- Leader: On the day you were baptized, you received the sign of the cross over your forehead and heart to mark you as one redeemed by Jesus Christ. Today that sign is used again as a testimony to the gift God has given you in Christ. In mercy, God has sent His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. So, in His stead and by His command, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Leader: In baptism, we were united to the suffering and death of Jesus Christ and cleansed of sin by His blood. In baptism, we were renewed and called to a life of daily repentance and faith which clings to our Savior. Today, we come to renew that faith once more. In baptism you, or your sponsors on your behalf, responded to the grace of God by renouncing the devil and all his works and all his ways. So, I ask you anew, do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

People: Yes, I renounce them.

Leader: In baptism you, or your sponsors on your behalf, responded to the call of God by proclaiming the Christian faith. So, I ask you anew, do you believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth?

People: Yes, I believe.

Leader: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son?

People: Yes, I believe He is my Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

- People: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
- Leader: The Almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you the new birth of water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you all your sins, will strengthen you with His grace to life everlasting. Through baptism He has promised you both eternal joys and daily strength.

Leader: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

+ Holy Communion +

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Bethany in the joyful confession that our Lord gives us His very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins in this sacrament. God intends this gift for His children who recognize their sin, trust in Christ as their Savior, desire to live for Him alone and join in this joyful confession.

To help you prepare for communion we invite you to take a few moments of quiet prayer. For aid there are prayers on the front page of the hymnal for both before and after the reception of communion. Or simply pray, Dear Lord Jesus, at Your gracious invitation You invite me to come to You, to eat and drink Your holy body and blood as You Yourself have promised to give in this sacrament of Your altar. Forgive me of my sin, through this Your meal of Forgiveness. Let me experience the fullness of Your love, through this Your meal of love. Strengthen my faith, through this meal of Yours that calls for and bestows faith. Empower me to live for You, through this Your meal that promises life everlasting and equips me for daily living as one who has received You and Your gifts.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION:

Leader: He who brought you to Himself in the waters of baptism now comes to you through bread and wine with the body and blood of Christ Jesus.

"For on the night in which He was betrayed..."



The wafers next to the Christ candle side are <u>gluten free</u>; for those with dietary restrictions, please take a gluten free wafer. For those wishing to use a self-contained communion chalice, let an usher know.

In our 9:30 a.m. service we will practice the Easter tradition of continuous communion. We will not kneel at the altar, rather we will join the procession of saints and come forward and remain standing as we receive the bread and wine. After receiving the elements, you are invited to return to your seat and continue in meditation, prayer and song.


