FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We lost one of Bethany's biggest cheerleaders this weekend: Mr. Doug Hensley went home to heaven on Saturday.

Mr. Hensley ("Hensley Square" is named for him) spent his entire 40-year career here at Bethany. He started as a teacher and become Bethany's second principal in 1981. During his tenure as principal, he oversaw a school building expansion, the addition of our EDC/Summer Camp program and the advent of computer education/Internet access. He also saw the Bethany mascot change from the Bethany Bombers to the Bethany Braves and finally to the Bethany Bears. :)

Mr. Hensley was known and beloved for so many things:

- He loved Jesus and found his identity and calling as His baptized child.
- He was a master storyteller.
- He loved to travel and share his travel stories with others via his famous slide shows.
- He loved art, taught art, collected Catalina pottery and created beautiful banners.
- He loved music, had season tickets to the LA Philharmonic and was a tenor in the Bethany choir.
- He had a historian's heart...the school office files are stuffed with his notes of Bethany history.
- He loved being connected to multiple generations of Bethany students and families.
- He was a great encourager, especially to Bethany's third principal.:)

In December 1999, Mr. Hensley wrote a letter that is now buried in our time capsule by the flagpole in Freedom Square. It is filled with his visions of the future, many of which have already come true. But I will leave you with his ending:

"My hope is that Bethany Lutheran School [has] a wonderful Centennial Celebration in 2047, and continues to be a vital part of the community. My hope is that you are sitting in your office reading this letter while Christmas songs are playing, sweet tangerines are awaiting your attention, and the sounds of happy children can be heard in the distance."

Thank you for giving so much to the Bethany community, Mr. Hensley. You have kept the faith and finished the race, and have now received the crown of righteousness. You will be missed!

Bethany Lutheran is committed to a Pre-K through 8th grade model to prepare students for high school. These middle school years are a key time for students to deeply understand who God created them to be and to learn to make mindful, God-pleasing choices.

Bethany's buddy system provides middle school students with the opportunity to be responsible and uplifting, while giving the younger students a friendly face to see around campus and a helper at school events.

Starting in 6th grade the students are paired with buddies in Bethany's Pre-K and TK classes. Approximately 1-2 times a month these buddies will get together for a planned activities. Our 7th and 8th grade students accompany their buddies to chapel weekly, where they can participate and worship together. These buddies are also on the same Bear Teams so they see each other at monthly Bear Team events. And they bond during other planned events throughout the year as well!

Grandparents and Special Friends Day


Friday, November 18 8:30-12:00
